

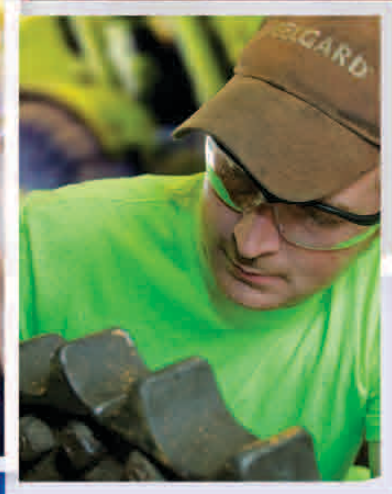

New Student Admissions

If you have never attended Central Lakes College and wish to register for classes, contact the Admissions Office of the campus you plan on attending - Brainerd Campus at 218.855.8037 or Staples Campus at 218.894.5175.

Easy Steps to Admission

1. Application

Submit a completed CLC application with \$20 application fee. Students can also apply on-line @www.clcmn.edu.

2. Transcripts

High school transcripts are required for all students who are high school graduates. To transfer credits from another college an official transcript is required.

3. Financial Aid

Apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online @ www.fafsa.gov in order to determine your eligibility for aid.

4. Assessment/Orientation/Registration

College assessment and orientation are required for all new students attending Central Lakes College. Returning students must re-assess if they have not assessed within the last two years. Students may be exempt if they have successfully completed college level English and college math. Upon acceptance to the college, information will be mailed to you with assessment and orientation procedures and dates.

Who Can Register Online?

- Continuing students in good academic standing
- New students who have completed the admissions process

Who Can't Register Online?

- Students with academic, business office or library holds
- Continuing PSEO students who have not turned in their signed PSEO forms
- Any student who has not gone through the Admissions Process.

Online Registration Guide

To access the online registration, you will need:

- Your CLC Student Tech ID (located on your CLC picture ID, printed class schedule or tuition statements) or your Social Security #.
- Your Password (see steps 2-3).
- A CLC course schedule - use either the online course schedule or the printed copy.

Step 1: Open your web browser and type in this address: <http://www.clcmn.edu> and click the Visit the Student E-Services site: link located at the top of the screen.

Step 2: At the CLC login screen, enter your Student Tech ID number (this is not your social security number). If you do not know your Student Tech ID number, click on the "Lookup ID" or use the Help Videos.

Step 3: At the "Lookup ID" screen, you need to enter your Social Security number (no spaces or hyphens) and your Password. Your initial Password is your birth date in year, month and day order (yymmdd). Example: If your birthday is January 27, 1982, your initial Password would be 820127. After entering the system for the first time,

you will be required to change your initial Password to a Password known only to you. Your new Password must be between 8 and 20 characters long, contain a letter (A-Z), a number (0-9), and a special character (!&@#%^*(){}[]+=<>). Your Password cannot match your User ID. YOU NEED TO REMEMBER THIS Password. Now click on "Lookup ID". The screen will now show your CLC Login ID number. Remember this Password - you will need it every time you use CLC Online Registration.

Step 4: At the Central Lakes College E-Services Login screen, enter your Student Tech ID number and your Password, check the "Display My Name" box and click on "Login".

NOTE: Before you begin to register, you can check for any registration holds you may have as well as for the earliest date you may register for courses.

To Check for Registration Holds, click on "Courses and Registration".

- Click on "Check Registration Holds".
- Any registration hold, academic, business office or library hold will be displayed on the screen.

To Check When You Can Register, click on "Courses and Registration".

- Click on "Registration Window". Your registration start date and time will be displayed.

Step 5: Now you are ready to register. Click on "Courses and Registration".

Step 6: Click on "Quick Add (Register)". Change the term if necessary (Example: Spring 2011 Jan.-May).

Step 7: To register for courses, enter the 6-digit Course ID for each course, up to eight courses, in the Course ID column. You will find the Course ID numbers on the first line of each course listing in the class schedule. (Helpful Hint: Prior to registering for classes, have your course I.D. #'s written down). You may enter up to 8 courses on a single screen.

Step 8: When you finish entering your classes, click on "Register Now", click on "Register for these Courses", enter your Password and click on "Register".

Step 9: Always check your course schedule! Click on "View/Modify Class Schedule".

Step 10: When you complete the registration process, be sure to click on "Logout" at the top right of your screen.

For each of the following tasks, open your web browser and type in this address: <http://www.clcmn.edu>. Click the E-SERVICES link located at the top of the screen. Enter your Student Tech ID number and your PASSWORD, check the "Display My Name" box and click on "Login".

To Search for a Course

Step 1: Click on "Find a Course".

Step 2: Click on the Subject drop down box to choose a subject area.

Step 3: Click on "Find Courses".

Step 4: All open sections will be displayed.

To Drop a Course

NOTE: Students have 5 free drop/add days at the beginning of fall and spring semesters and 3 free drop/add days at the beginning of summer session. Students will NOT be able to WITHDRAW online.

Step 1: Click on the "View/Modify Class Schedule".

Step 2: Click on the Course ID of the class you wish to drop.

Step 3: Click on the drop down box "Make a selection..." and choose "Drop/Withdraw". Click on "Process".

Step 4: Enter your Password and click on "Process Request".

To Change your Grading Method

Step 1: Click on "Courses and Registration".

Step 2: Click on "View/Modify Class schedule".

Step 3: Click on 6-digit Course ID number.

Step 4: Click on "Make a Selection" & select "Change Grade Method".

Step 5: Click on "Grade Method" and select "Audit".

Step 6: Click on "Process".

Step 7: Enter your Password.

Step 8: Click on "Process Request".

Note: The grading method will always default to "Letter Grade". Therefore, if you chose to change your grade method to "Audit", you must do so before the free semester drop/add period ends.

To Change Your Password

Step 1: Click on "Account Management".

Step 2: Click on "Change Password".

Step 3: Enter your current 6 digit Password. Enter your Password. Re-enter the same new Password. Click on "Change".

Step 4: You will want to remember this new Password.

Step 5: Note: Your new Password becomes effective immediately.

Your new Password must be between 8 and 20 characters long, contain a letter (A-Z), a number (0-9), and a special character (!&@#%^*(){}[]+=<>). Your Password cannot match your User ID.

To Display Your Class Schedule

Step 1: Click on "View/Modify Class Schedule".

Step 2: Change semester, if necessary.

Step 3: Your class schedule will be displayed on the screen.

Step 4: To print your schedule, click on "File", click on "Print", click on "OK", or click on the "Print" icon.

To View Grades and Grade Point Average

Step 1: Click on "Grades and Transcripts".

Step 2: Choose the appropriate semester from the drop down list.

Step 3: Click on "Continue".

Step 3: Your courses, grades, term GPA and cumulative GPA will be displayed on the screen.

To View Unofficial Copy of your Transcript

Step 1: Click on "Grades and Transcripts".

Step 2: Click on "Academic Record".

Step 3: Click on "Get Academic Record".

To View Degree Audit Report (DARS)

Step 1: Click on "Grades and Transcripts".

Step 2: Click on "Interactive Degree Audit Report".

Step 3: Click on the following major(s) to open a new window, which will display your DARS Audit(s).

Step 4: Click on "Printer Friendly".

Step 5: Print "DARS Report".

Note: If your program in DARS is not correct, please stop by the Admission and Counseling Center to complete the "Program Change" form.

Did you forget your Student Tech ID?

Step 1: Click on "Lookup ID" located on the left of the screen.
Step 2: Enter your SSN plus the corresponding PIN/Password.
Step 3: Click on "Lookup ID".

Did you forget your Password?

Step 1: Click on "Lookup Password" located on the left of the screen.
Step 2: Enter your Student Tech ID or User Name.
Step 3: Click on "Get Password".

Note: Your PASSWORD is considered your "signature". A PASSWORD must be kept confidential as it allows anyone who knows it to access your private data. TUITION, FEES & FINANCIAL AID

Central Lakes College does not mail tuition statements. The act of registration is considered an acknowledgement on the part of the student that he/she will attend and pay for the registered courses. It is the responsibility of the student to review their account on-line and pay their bill in a timely manner, according to the due dates noted below. For current account information please check online @ www.clcmn.edu. Select e-Services at the top of the screen and log in using your Student Tech ID and PIN.

Financial Aid disbursement: Fall and Spring 12th day of semester

Tuition payments must be received, in the Business Office, by 4:30 p.m. 5 business days prior to the start of the semester.

Fully online courses are assessed an additional \$35.00 per credit. Certain lab and technical courses may be charged a higher rate of tuition. Additional fees may apply depending on the courses for which a student registers. Central Lakes College charges in-state tuition to all students unless another state's reciprocity agreement dictates otherwise.

Late Fee/Payment Plan Fee

All students who have not paid their tuition and fees in full, by the 20th day of the semester are considered to be on the CLC internal payment plan and will be charged a \$30 fee. This fee applies each semester. Students using the FACTS payment plan are not charged this fee. All students not paid in full by the end of the 13th week of the semester will be charged a \$25 late fee.

Dishonored Checks/NSF Fee

Checks will be considered NSF/dishonored after they have been presented to the bank twice and are returned to Central Lakes College unpaid due to non-sufficient funds, closed account, stop payment, etc. Dishonored checks will be backed out of the account to which they were deposited and the NSF fee will be charged. If the reversal of the receipt causes the account to become unpaid after the due date, applicable late charges will also be added to the account. The NSF fee is currently \$30 and is subject to change without notice.

Senior Citizen Costs

In May 2010, the Minnesota legislature voted to change the senior citizen age from 62 to 66. This change took effect August 2, 2010.

Persons 66 years of age and older may enroll in courses, on a space available basis, for an administrative fee of \$20 per semester credit in lieu of tuition. Senior citizens are exempt from student activity and health services fees, but are required to pay all other applicable student fees. Senior citizens who audit a course do not pay the \$20 administrative fee, student activity fee or health services fees, but are still responsible for all other applicable fees.

Late Start/Short-Term Registration

For Students enrolled in a late start (beginning after the start of the semester) or short-term (less than 5 weeks in length) class, tuition is due, in full, the first day of class. Students may register for late start classes up to the first day of class.

Management Programs

For students enrolled in Small Business Management and Computerizing Small Business tuition and fees are due, in full, at the time of registration. Students may register for classes up to the last business day prior to the start of finals. Farm Business Management students may register for classes up to mid-term, but tuition and fees are due at the time of registration.

Payment Options

Students have several options for paying their tuition and fees:

The CLC Business Office accepts cash, check, cashier's check, money order, debit card, VISA, and MasterCard.

2. Payment Plans

Nelnet (formerly FACTS) Payment Plan

To help students meet their educational expenses, Central Lakes College is proud to offer Nelnet as a convenient budget plan. This is not a loan program. There is no debt, there are no interest or finance charges assessed, and there is no credit check.

- The cost to budget an interest-free monthly payment plan is a \$25 per semester, non-refundable enrollment fee.
- Tuition and fees may be budgeted in the following ways:
 - Automatic Bank Payment (ACH) – made from either a checking or savings account. Payments are processed on the 5th of each month and will continue until the balance is paid in full.
 - Credit Card Option – monthly payment is automatically charged to a designated credit card. Payments will be charged on the 5th of each month until the balance is paid in full.
- Apply online @ http://www.clcmn.edu/business_office/ and click on "Payment & Deferral Options", "Payment Plans", and then on the e-Cashier logo.

CLC Payment Plan

- A minimum payment of \$350 is required 5 days prior to the start of the semester.
- The remaining balance is due at the start of mid-term.
- A \$30 fee applies to this option.

3. Deferment

Students may defer payment based on one or more of the following:

- Financial Aid
 - Five days prior to the start of the semester, the student must have filed for financial aid and have an ISIR on file with the college. An ISIR is a notice, sent to the college, from the Department of Education confirming the FAFSA (Free Application for Student Aid) has been received. This defers payment until the 20th class day of the semester (10th class day for summer).
 - Financial aid file must be complete by 4:30 p.m. on the 20th class day of semester for fall and spring (10th class day for summer). This means an award letter has been received and all required paperwork has been completed.

b. Third Party Funding (such as CEP or DRS benefits) – The college is in possession of a funding authorization, in an amount adequate to cover charges, five days prior to the start of the semester.

c. Scholarships. The college has received scholarship funds on your behalf.

d. VETS – Individuals receiving military funding are eligible for a six-week tuition deferment, provided the College has proper documentation indicating the student will receive funding.

Students Receiving Financial Aid

Note: the fee statement does not list the amount of financial aid a student is eligible to receive. It shows the amount of tuition and fees owed. The financial aid award letter lists the types and amounts of funding a student is eligible to receive based on the number of enrolled credits. The two documents should be compared to determine if the student will personally owe the college for any of the tuition costs. Remember: a separate loan promissory note must be completed in order to borrow a student loan.

Registration Cancellation for Non-Payment

Students, who do not have their accounts paid in full by the tuition due date (five days prior to the start of each semester), or have not made payment arrangements, will have the class registrations cancelled for non-payment. A student can prevent class registrations from being cancelled for non-payment by:

- Signing a FACTS payment plan,
- Filing for financial aid,
- Submitting a written third party funding authorization to the college,
- Making a down payment of \$350 or 15% of balance owing on their account.

The registration cancellation for non-payment process will occur:

- 5 days prior to the start of the semester,
- On the 5th day of the semester, after the free add/drop period has ended,
- On the 20th day of the semester, after financial aid has applied (10th day of summer semester),
- Periodically throughout the semester to incorporate late start classes.

If a student's class registration is cancelled for non-payment, between five days prior to the start of the semester and the end of the free drop/add period, the student may re-register for classes, depending on class availability and provided appropriate payment arrangements are made. After the 20th day of the semester, students will not be allowed to re-register.

Note: Students enrolled in internship programs are exempt from registration cancellation. If a student does not intend to participate in their internship, it is the responsibility of the student to notify the college of that decision and drop the course.

Non-Payment

If a student does not pay for all enrolled credits by the end of the semester, the student will:

- Not be able register for future terms, until the debt is paid in full.
- Not receive a transcript or diploma/degree, until the debt is paid in full.
- Be referred to Minnesota Department of Revenue for collections.

Add/Drop/Withdrawal

Add/Drop

The add/drop period is the first five business days of the fall and spring semesters and the first three days of summer semester. During this time, you may add and drop individual classes. Classes dropped during this period will receive a 100% refund of any tuition and fees paid.

For courses meeting once a week, students are allowed to:

- Add the course up to the second day of class and
- Drop the course one business day after the first class session.

For courses less than three weeks in length, students are allowed to:

- Add the course up to the second day of class and
- Drop the course one business day after the first class session.

For courses 3 to 10 weeks in length, students may add or drop the class through the end of the third class day.

Note: If a student makes changes to their class schedule, adds or drops a class, the changes to the student's account are available on-line. If the student receives financial aid, changes may impact the student's financial aid award.

Individual Course Withdrawal

If a student registers for a course and later decides not to attend CLC, the student must notify Records and Registration and complete the proper paperwork to withdraw from the course after the free drop/add period. Students may withdraw from a course up to ten days before the first day of final exams. If the student properly withdraws from a course, after the free add/drop period, a "W" will be recorded on his/her transcript. Withdrawing from a course does not impact GPA, but it may affect satisfactory academic progress.

Total Withdrawal

If planning to totally withdraw from CLC, the Financial Aid office must be notified and the required paperwork completed. If the College is not notified and the withdraw form is not properly completed,

- The student may owe the College for tuition and fees, even if no longer attending classes.
- The student will receive a grade from the instructor, most likely an "F".

A student will be required to repay all or some of any financial aid received, if:

- Withdrawing from all classes on or before 60% of the completed term,
- No longer attending and fails to notify the college.

Refunds

Withdrawing from individual classes after the add/drop period does NOT generate a refund.

Amount of Tuition and Fees Refunded if Totally Withdrawing From the College

100%	days 1-5 of the semester
75%	days 6-10
50%	days 11-15
25%	days 16-20
0%	after day 20

If enrolled in a course that is less than a full semester in length, the amount of Tuition and Fees refunded, if totally withdrawing differs slightly:

For courses that are 3 – 10 weeks in length

Appeals

Appeals for Tuition and Fees Refund

After the drop/add period has expired, a refund of all or part of the tuition paid may be given under certain circumstances. Students may apply for an Administrative Refund for the following reasons only:

- Death in the immediate family (that can be documented).
- Medical Reasons: injury or illness that requires a prolonged absence. A doctor's statement, on physician's letterhead, is required and must declare that the medical condition impairs the student's ability to attend or complete classes.
- Significant Personal Circumstances (that can be corroborated by an independent professional, such as a social worker, lawyer or law enforcement agent).
- Natural Disaster or other similar situation (that can be documented).
- Military duty (letter of assignment or notice of recall is required).

If an Administrative Refund is granted, classes are dropped, no grades are awarded and the student's transcript is not impacted. Appeal forms are available from the Business Office. Forms must be completed and signed by the student. Appeals must be made within ninety calendar days of the end of the semester for which the debt was incurred. No appeals will be considered for debt greater than ninety days old. A committee reviews all Administrative Refund Appeals.

*In the case of illness or injury, a family member is defined as the spouse, minor or dependant children/stepchildren/foster children (including wards and children for whom the student is legal guardian), or parent/step-parent living in the same household as the student.

**In the case of death, a family member is defined as the spouse or domestic partner, the parents and grandparents of the spouse, the parents/step-parents, grandparents, guardian, children, grandchildren, brothers, sisters, wards, or stepchildren of the student.

Appeals for Registration Cancellation for Non-payment

If your classes are cancelled for non-payment after the 20th day of the semester, you cannot attend classes or re-register for classes until an appeal has been granted. If you choose to appeal the cancellation, the following must be complete before the first day of final exams for the semester (no appeals will be granted once the semester has ended):

- Obtain a statement from the Business Office. Complete the appeal form.

- Obtain instructor(s) signature(s) for each class you were previously registered for, as listed on your statement.

- ALL your classes that were cancelled for non-payment MUST be re-added. If you choose not to re-add a class or an instructor will not allow you to re-add a class, you will receive a “W” grade for the class.

- Return the completed form with ALL required signatures and a copy of your schedule to the Business Office.

If your appeal is granted, you are financially obligated for all the classes for which you were originally registered. PAYMENT IN FULL must be made prior to your courses being re-added.

There is no obligation on the part of faculty to assist you in getting caught up in your course work as a result of the registration cancellation for non-payment. A committee reviews all Registration Cancellation for Non-Payment Appeals.

Appeal for Tuition Deferment

If you have a documented hardship, you may be eligible for a tuition deferment. A tuition deferral is only available during the academic year; deferrals are not available for summer semester.

Deferrals will only be considered if all of the following conditions are addressed and documented:

- Student has a financial hardship.

- Student has sufficient financial resources in place to cover the current balance due as well as any tuition and fees incurred for the next semester. Student should attach a copy of financial aid award letter or other relevant paperwork to demonstrate sufficient financial resources. Student must attach a list of the courses they intend to register for to determine if they have sufficient funds to pay for those courses.

- Student is maintaining at least a 2.0 GPA during the current semester. Student must attach a copy of their current schedule and it must have their current grade and the instructor’s signature next to each course listed. Student must attach an unofficial transcript.

- Supporting documentation MUST be attached to the appeal form for the appeal to be considered.

Appeal forms are available from the Business Office. Forms must be completed and signed by the student. A committee reviews all Tuition Deferral Appeals.

Appeals for Minimum Payment

If unable to pay the minimum down payment, please contact the Business Office.

Auditing a Course

Students who register to audit a course for neither credit nor grade will pay the regular tuition rate. Students auditing a course must also meet course prerequisites. Financial assistance does not apply to audited courses.

Confidentiality of Financial Records

The General Education Provision of Act of 1974, as amended by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, provides for privacy safeguards for students and families by setting up guidelines for the disclosure of education records and personally identifiable information. The law provides that financial assistance records of a student may be inspected by that student only. A student may provide

written notice of release of information to other family members if desired.

Financial Assistance

Central Lakes College is dedicated to bringing the highest quality of education within reach of every person who has a desire to pursue a college education. The Financial Aid office at CLC has developed a comprehensive financial aid program based on federal, state, and institutional resources to help cover the cost of education. CLC annually awards assistance to about 70 percent of its student body. Therefore, no prospective student should hesitate to apply for admission because of financial circumstances. The CLC Financial Aid staff encourages all students to apply for financial aid. For the most current information regarding Financial Aid please visit the CLC Web site at www.clcmn.edu/financialaid.

Eligibility Requirements:

Unless otherwise stated, students receiving financial aid must:

1. Demonstrate financial need, as determined by the results of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA);
2. Have a high school diploma, GED, or pass an “ability to benefit” test;
3. Be enrolled and attend class as a regular student in a degree program of at least one academic semester in duration that leads to a certificate, degree or other recognized credential and prepares students for gainful employment in a recognized occupation;
4. Maintain federal and state regulations requiring that all persons receiving financial aid meet the college’s Standards of Academic Probation and Suspension.
5. Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen;
6. Not be in default on any student loan or owe a refund to any student grant program;
7. Be registered for Selective Service (if required).
8. Must attend each class at least once.

How is Eligibility Determined?

Most financial assistance is awarded on the basis of financial need and may include a combination of the various types of aid. Need is defined as the difference between the cost of attending Central Lakes College and the available resources of the student and student’s family to meet these costs (determined by the results of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

How to Apply for Financial Aid:

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available after January 1 of each year. (The FAFSA needs to be completed online each year the student is in school.) If you have Internet access, you can file a FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov. A paper FAFSA may be requested by directly contacting the US Department of Education. Please contact the Financial Aid office if you have questions. Students who have a completed financial aid application on file with the college by June 1 receive priority consideration for campus based aid (FSEOG and student employment). After June 1, applications are reviewed on a first-come, first-serve basis. Separate applications are needed for Post-Secondary Child Care Grant program, Alliss Grant, Start-up Scholarship, Foundation Scholarships, and any student loan.

Types of Financial Assistance

Financial aid comes in three basic categories: Grants and Scholarships, Student Employment and Loans.

1. Grants and Scholarships: Are gifts that are not repaid unless you drop, totally withdraw from class, or never attend a class. Types of grants or scholarships include:

Federal Pell Grant - This is a federal grant awarded to eligible students. Students must demonstrate financial need.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) - This is a federally funded grant administered by the college. Students must demonstrate high financial need. Awards are limited to funds available.

Minnesota State Grant - This is for Minnesota residents attending a Minnesota college only based on eligibility.

Post-Secondary Child Care Grant Program - Income-based grant for students who have children in day care. Awards are limited to funds available.

Alliss Grant - (Liberal Arts & Science Students) - This grant pays for up to one four-credit class and the required books of that class, to students entering college after being out of school for seven years. A student may receive it once. Course fees are not covered by this grant.

Academic Competitiveness Grant - (Students pursuing an AA or AAS degree) Must be a Pell Grant recipient who has completed a defined rigorous set of high school courses.

Start-up Scholarship - (Technical Education Students) - This grant pays for up to a three-credit class. This is an income-based eligibility. Offered one time only. Must not have attended school within the last five years. Awards are limited to funds available.

CLC Foundation Scholarships - CLC has an extensive scholarship program for a variety of scholarship applicants. A CLC Foundation Scholarship application is required. Certain deadlines apply. Check with the Foundation office, Admissions, Financial Aid or the Counseling/Career Center for more information and application form.

Outside scholarships - Announced in community newspapers and the campus newspaper. A student may also check in the Foundation office.

2. Student Employment: Provides students with opportunities to earn money to help meet educational costs. Students must complete the FAFSA to demonstrate financial need in order to qualify. Student employment is viewed as a regular job with responsibilities and employer expectations. Students receive an hour's pay for an hour's work. Jobs are available both on-campus or at designated off-campus sites. A listing of available jobs can be found on the college's Web site under Financial Aid.

3. Student Loans: Money that is borrowed and must be repaid. All borrowers must complete loan counseling and complete a separate online loan application.

Federal Direct Student Loan programs (subsidized and unsubsidized) Low-interest loans obtained from a bank, savings and loan or credit union. Interest will not exceed 8 1/4% with long-term payments beginning six months after enrollment drops below six credits.

Federal Direct Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS) - This loan has a variable interest rate, not to exceed 9%, with payments due within 60 days after the loan is fully disbursed.

Federal Perkins Loan - A student must show high financial need for this low interest loan at 5%. Recipients are determined by CLC according to the amount of funds available. Priority is given to students who have their financial aid file completed prior to June 1.

Steps for Receiving Student Financial Aid

1. The student must be accepted for admission and enrolled at Central Lakes College.

2. The student must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

3. The U.S. Department of Education processor sends a Student Aid Report (SAR) to the student via email or U.S. mail.

4. The U.S. Department of Education processor automatically sends the college your information when you have entered the appropriate college code on the FAFSA. Central Lakes College code is 002339.

5. An institutional Financial Aid Information Form (FAIF), available in the Financial Aid office, needs to be completed and returned to the Financial Aid office. Forms are available via the CLC Web site.

6. Paperwork such as taxes (parent and/or student) and an Institutional Verification Form (IVF) may be required.

7. Students transferring from one college to another in the middle of the academic year must inform both schools of their intent to transfer.

8. An estimated award letter will be sent to the student after the financial aid file is completed. This award letter will explain your grant, loan and work eligibility. Your financial aid award will be finalized at the time of disbursement.

9. Financial aid awards are based on the number of credits at time of disbursement. Students who add a class after their aid has been disbursed may not be eligible for additional financial aid. Students who withdraw from a class prior to their aid being disbursed do not receive aid for the withdrawn class.

10. If you or your family have unusual circumstances, (such as unusual medical or dental expenses not paid by insurance, loss of income or assets) please contact the Financial Aid office.

Return of Federal Financial Aid

Any student considering totally withdrawing from the college must contact the Financial Aid office before making a decision to totally withdraw. Federal regulations require that students who totally withdraw from all classes on or before 60% of the completed term must repay a portion of their federal financial aid. Withdrawal on or before 60% of the completed term means that a student has not earned all of the financial aid he/she was paid. The amount of "unearned aid" is calculated with the following formula:

$$\frac{\text{Days remaining in term}}{\text{Total days in term}} = \frac{\text{Unearned Federal Aid}}{\text{Total Federal Aid}}$$

The Unearned Federal Aid percentage identifies the amount of aid a student must repay. If the percentage is less than 40%, no repayment

of federal funds is required. The Return of Federal Financial Aid policy applies to the following federal aid programs and funds must be returned in this order: Stafford Loans, Perkins Loans, PLUS loans, Pell Grants, SEOG Grants. Refunds to Minnesota financial aid programs are calculated appropriately using CLC's Refund policy.-

Impact of Total Withdrawals before the 60% percentage point of time

Students may receive financial aid either as a credit to an account or as a cash payment. If funds have been credited to the student account and the college has an obligation to return federal funds, the student will owe a balance to the college. When a student owes a balance to the college for unpaid tuition/fees, repayment arrangements must be made within 30 days. If the student fails to make repayment arrangements, the college will turn the balance owed the college to the Minnesota Revenue Recapture Program. Examples of these calculations are available upon request in the CLC Financial Aid office. Refunds to Financial Aid Programs are conducted before the student would receive a withdrawal refund. For students receiving State financial aid funding, Minnesota Higher Education Services Offices policies will apply.

Unofficial Withdrawals

Any student who stops attending but does not officially withdraw will be considered an unofficial withdrawal. For unofficial withdrawals the last date of attendance is defined as the student's last date of recorded attendance or the midpoint of the semester. Unofficial withdrawals will not receive a refund of tuition or fees. Unofficial withdrawals who receive Federal financial aid will have 50% of the financial aid considered to be "unearned" and the Return of Federal funds policies, as described in the impact of Total Withdrawals section, will apply. Students must attend each class at least once to receive a portion of their financial aid.

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Federal law requires that a recipient of state or federal financial aid make satisfactory academic progress toward a degree, diploma or certificate. All students are required to maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average and/or complete a minimum of 67% of cumulative registered credits, and complete their program within 150% of the program length in credits. In addition, the Financial Aid office is required by the U.S. Department of Education to monitor whether or not a student will be able to graduate in a timely fashion.

Based upon U.S. Department of Education regulations, Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) policy states "once the institution determines that it is not possible for a student to raise his/her GPA (2.0) or course completion percentage (67%) to meet the institutions standards before the student would reach the end of the program, the student shall be suspended from financial aid". CLC has a Financial Aid office on each campus. The complete Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy can be found the Academic Policies section.

Critical Information When Purchasing Supplies and Textbooks

Please bring your schedule to the bookstore when purchasing books. The bookstore shelves are arranged alphabetically by department with the books for each course located above the shelf tag. Match the information on the shelf tags to your schedule. It is important to verify that you are choosing the books for the correct section of your course. The bookstore staff will help you locate your books and supplies whenever possible. A book list for the semester is available on our website @ www.clcbookstore.com.

Textbook Buyback

CLC bookstores offer textbook buyback throughout the year. A current student I.D. is required to complete the transaction. No receipt is needed for buyback and the bookstores pay in cash. Books are being purchased for the campus bookstores and for a wholesale book company. The bookstores' greatest need for books is at the end of the semester during the week of finals. Watch for announcements of the dates and times of buyback. Study guides, lab manuals and workbooks are bought under limited conditions. Books bundled with multiple components such as CD's, diskettes, supplemental pamphlets, etc. must have all components to be bought back.

Returns and Refunds

Save your receipt! All returns require a cash register receipt. Textbook returns can be made within the first 5 days of the semester for a full refund. Courses with a start date beginning later in the semester have a 48-hour return period from the class start date. Books purchased in shrink-wrap may be returned at a used price if opened. Unopened software may be returned within 24 hours of date of purchase.

Financial Aid Payment Options

Important! Charging at the bookstore begins two weeks prior to the start of the semester and runs through the seventh day of the semester for financial aid. All students charging must obtain a charging authorization from the Business Office before coming to the bookstore to purchase books. A picture ID is required when charging books. Students with a completed financial aid file have the opportunity to charge textbooks and supplies toward their Pell, MN State Grant, SEOG Grant, Scholarships and/or loans. Students may charge against the excess of their financial aid funds over tuition and fees.

Third party funded students (Rural MN CEP, DVR, VA, TAA, Alliss, etc.) are allowed to charge if they have a written funding authorization on file with the business office. Post Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) students are allowed to charge required books and a reasonable amount of required supplies that will be used up in their courses. Books charged by PSEO students are the property of Central Lakes College. Books must be returned to the bookstore at the end of the semester. Books required for developmental course are not covered by PSEO.

HOW TO READ THE COURSE SCHEDULE

At the top of each page of the course schedule is a line of column headings. Here's what each heading means:

CRS ID – This is a six-digit number used to identify courses for online registration.

COURSE – The course consists of two parts:

- Four-letter department code for the subject area.
- Four-digit course number. The first digit represents the following:
0 developmental course
1 recommended first-year course
2 recommended second-year course

The second digit represents the following:

- 1 required technical course
- 2 required technical course
- 3 elective technical course
- 4 MN General Education Transfer Curriculum course
- 5 liberal arts elective course, not part of MN General Education Transfer curriculum

SEC – The first digit of this number indicates the type or location of the class:

- 01-19 lab sections
- 20-39 Brainerd Campus
- 50-69 Staples Campus
- 70-98 Distance Education (ITV, off campus, web)

TITLE – Course title may be abbreviated to fit the space. See the college catalog for the full course name.

BTIME – The beginning time for the class is listed in this column. ARR means the class time is arranged.

ETIME – The ending time for the class is listed in this column. ARR means the class time is arranged.

DAYS – Days refers to the days of the week the class is held. The following letters represent each day of the week classes are held:

M-Monday T-Tuesday W-Wednesday R-Thursday F-Friday
SA-Saturday SU-Sunday

ROOM – This is the room number and campus where the class meets. The following is a list of abbreviations used in this schedule:

STUDENT SUPPORT



ACADEMIC CENTERS FOR ENRICHMENT (ACE)

Academic Centers for Enrichment (ACE) help prepare students for achievement in college classes. The services coordinated through this area include computer-assisted instruction, study group facilitation, supplemental instruction, and tutoring services.

COUNSELING SERVICES

Counselors assist students in exploring their career options through individual counseling, test interpretation, group seminars and providing resources to gather career information. They assist students with selecting courses for Central Lakes College diplomas, degrees, and certificates. This includes explaining prerequisites and assessment placements, helping with transfer issues and directing students to campus resources. They assist students in planning for their academic success. Counselors meet with students to discuss areas of concern that may interfere with college success.

FINANCIAL AID

The Financial Aid Office at CLC has developed a comprehensive financial aid program based on federal, state, institutional and private resources to help cover the cost of education. CLC annually awards assistance to about 70 percent of its student body. The CLC Financial Aid staff encourages all students to apply for financial aid.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Central Lakes College Foundation is a nonprofit 501C-3 organization formed to solicit, receive and administer gifts, grants, bequests and donations. The mission of the CLC Foundation is to provide financial assistance in the form of scholarships to students at CLC.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

CLC is committed to accommodating the needs of students with disabilities or disadvantages. The Disability Coordinator is the contact person for students needing services, including assistance in working individually with faculty and administration, intervention procedures, and grievance procedures.

TRIO

This student support services program serves up to 180 CLC students per year. The focus of student support services is to foster an institutional climate supportive of the success of low-income, first-generation college students and individuals with disabilities. Areas of additional support to increase retention, graduation and transfer may include academic advising, access to technology, financial advising, and coordinating access to career information, campus visits, and transfer plans to four-year institutions.

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

The Veterans Resource Center provides information and support to military veterans, their families and community members. The goal of the Center is to provide a welcoming environment for all who visit or seek services. The Center has, or can locate information about veterans' services, financial resources, scholarships, veteran and family support activities and other items of interest to veterans, family members or community members. The Center encourages students or prospective students who are military veterans to contact the Center to arrange for priority registration. To be eligible for priority registration, the veteran must visit with a CLC counselor, develop a written educational plan, research available financial resources and agree to follow-up services if needed.
