Transfer Guide

Concordia has an excellent track record for accepting transfer credits. When you are accepted for admission at Concordia, you will receive an official transcript evaluation from our registrar. This will give you a clear idea on where you stand in relation to our graduation requirements. If you have applied early in the year, it will also be helpful in selecting other courses to take before you enroll at Concordia. Prior to the evaluation of your transcript, however, there are some general rules you may find helpful.

- Courses with grades of C- or higher will transfer.
- All courses equivalent to courses we offer will transfer.
- Courses that we do not offer will transfer as elective credit.

* It should be noted that this is a **guide** only for the purpose of helping you in course selection for transferring to Concordia. 1. Critical Inquiry Seminar:	
(Four semester hours) In-depth courses that emphasize the process of critical inquiry and student academic success.	Transfer students with 24 credits or more are exempt from the Inquiry Seminar.
2. Written Communication:	
(Four semester hours) The Written Communication course emphasizes academic writing as a way to learn, teach, and participate in an academic community.	
3. Oral Communication:	
(Four semester hours) In the Oral Communication course, students will learn to produce and critique reasoned and informed messages in public speaking and group settings.	
4. Religion I & II Courses:	
During your freshman or sophomore year, you will take Religion 100. During your junior or senior year you will take an additional course that you choose.	All religion courses will be taken at Concordia College.
