

The purpose of this course listing is to provide a suggested guide for transfer into the following program. This is a recommendation only. It is the student's responsibility to ensure proper course selection by contacting the transfer institution.

Elementary Education **St. Cloud State University**

A. MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM (MnTC): 40 General Ed. semester credits including:

1. Communications 9-11 credits
 Critical Thinking 1 course
 Natural Sciences 6 credits
 Math/Logical Reasoning 3 credits
 History/Social/Behavioral Sci. 9 credits
 Humanities/Fine Arts 9 credits
 Goals VII-X 1 course

2. Students transferring with an Associate in Arts Degree or a completed Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) satisfy the SCSU general education requirements.

3. It is recommended that students transfer after completion of the MnTC and as many required classes as time permits.

4. While completing the requirements for the MnTC, students may want to enroll in specific courses. The courses they choose will be dependent upon the specialty area they choose. Please visit with a counselor to determine these courses.

C. GRADE POINT AVERAGE REQUIREMENTS:

A Minimum GPA of 2.75 is required for admission. English 1410, 1411 and Speech 1431 or 1421 must be completed with grades of "C" or higher. Students must take the PPST prior to enrolling in education coursework. PPST test should be completed **early** in the second year of coursework at CLC. Applications are available in the CLC Counseling Department.
