A. MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM (MnTC): 40 General Ed. semester credits including:

 Natural Sciences 6 credits
 Math/Logical Reasoning 3 credits
 History/Social/Behavioral Sci. 9 credits
 Humanities/Fine Arts 9 credits
 Goals VII-X 1 course

2. Students transferring with an Associate in Arts Degree or a completed Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) satisfy the University of Minnesota general education requirements.

3. A baccalaureate degree is **not** required prior to enrolling in the Veterinary Medicine program.
