


Living Legacy Gardens



Main Gardens

These gardens are composed of annuals, perennials, shrubs, and trees that primarily are sun-loving plants that are hardy to zone 3. Particular beds are dedicated solely to beneficial pollinators. There is also a melodic rippling waterfall between two small ponds with fish, and a peaceful courtyard for times of reflection.



Shade Gardens

The shade gardens are composed of tranquil, shade loving plants. Hostas, bleeding hearts, heuchera, and ferns are the primary plants throughout this area.

Herb Gardens

This garden is comprised of herbs hardy to zone 3 plantings. Sage, thyme, basil, oregano, mint, chives, garlic, and chicory are artfully demonstrated.

Children’s Gardens

Every year the gardens attract young gardeners from the area to come and increase their gardening skills and try out new fruits and vegetables.



Funding

Recently, the gardens was awarded a \$2,000 grant from the Staples-Motley Area Community Foundation to support the purchase of plant signs with a QR code. When scanned by your phone, the QR code will take you to a website with general plant facts, recipes, plant care, and seasonal photos.



Visitors welcome throughout all four seasons of the year!


