The related employment rate of graduates is the percent of institution graduates who were available for related employment in the year after graduation who reported they were employed during the year after graduation in a job that was related to their program or major. The numerator is the number of graduates that were employed during the year after graduation in jobs they reported to be related to their program or major. The denominator is the number of graduates in related employment plus those seeking related employment and those available for work but unemployed. Students in prison programs and students in joint institution programs are excluded.

The established standard for obtaining an 80-85% response rate to the graduate follow-up survey was not met for the FY2022 cohort of graduates from Minnesota West Community and Technical College and Normandale Community College. Caution should be exercised in interpreting survey results in that they may not be fully representative of the graduates' outcomes at large.
