



6.11 Skateboarding and Other Recreational Activities Policy

Certain recreational activities, including skateboarding, longboarding, rollerblading, and cycling, are permitted on paved areas of the Central Lakes College campus. These recreational items may not be used inside the buildings.

Recreational users should always operate safely and respectfully. Tricks or other artistic expression while skateboarding or cycling will not be permitted on campus and are not allowed in/on locations that could cause damage to College property. Recreational users are cautioned against boarding at high speeds in areas frequented by pedestrians and motor vehicles, and should always yield to pedestrians.

No parkour-type activities are allowed that utilize college buildings, structures, equipment, or vehicles. High-lining and rappelling are not permitted on campus.

Personal Assistive mobility devices (e.g., Segways, scooters, motorized wheelchairs) may only be used in college buildings to accommodate a disability. The use of or charging of hover boards is not permitted on college property. Due to the increased risk of injury, the operation of non-program-related vehicles is prohibited in the Heavy Equipment Training Areas located on the Staples West Campus.

Campus Security authorities, or their designee, may request that a recreation user cease their activities on campus if they are deemed problematic. Campus Security will enforce this policy and continue working with the CLC community to ensure these activities remain safe, not only for participants but also for pedestrians in the area. These recreational activities all have inherent risks, mostly associated with falling, with the potential result of bruises or scrapes, and in more serious falls, broken bones, dislocated joints, and in the most serious cases, permanent injury and possibly even death. The College's position regarding participation in such activities is that participants do so at their own risk. Central Lakes College strongly encourages the use of safety equipment associated with the recreational activity. Participants are responsible for conducting these activities safely and will be liable for any injuries to bystanders or damage to property caused by their actions.

Failure to conduct any of these activities safely shall be considered a violation of this policy.

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
